Principal's Report (See attached).

Additional Discussion:

- *Outdoor projector in school technology budget- will move ahead with ordering for outdoor presentations. Microphone and speaker will also be ordered.*
- *CEAs for school total is 5, between 7 divisions, tricky with Thursday being offsite for most divisions.*
- *SCES will follow district guidelines for halloween costumes.*

Discussion about leaving Pumpkin walk as usual, or changing to circle in field, to then use after for school dance boundaries. Plan to leave as walk through forest.

- *Kelsie asked how CEA to student ratio determined? Seems like more help is needed. Discussion about parents supporting kids who need more 1:1 support. Sandra noting parents can't be made to attend school/field trips to support their child. Tyler wondering if this is a current issue that PAC needs to be addressing?*
- *Parents concerned with lack of CEA's that limit entire class, aware of inclusivity, but also ensuring activity opportunities for entire class. Discussion tabled- if specific issues are coming up to revisit.*

School Photography Notes - South Canoe Elementary

Option 1 -

- Every student is photographed.
- The number of images/poses per student would be negotiated ahead of time
 - *Most schools opt for a single pose. Some allow the option for families to pay for an add-on if they want more poses.*
- Sitting fee rates will start at \$20 per student for a single pose, with large discounts for a multi-pose package.
- Digital image files are edited and loaded into an online gallery.
- Families and school staff can visit the gallery and download their image without any additional purchases required.
- Additional print purchases will be available for those families who wish to have professional prints.
- Prints can also be made independently by the families and school using the digital images.
- The school and district have access to images for student files, class work, slideshows, etc.
 - *A secondary folder of small MyEd files would be created*
- Families pay the school or PAC to cover the costs
- If coordinated by the PAC, this can potentially be used as a fundraiser with families donating extra to the PAC and receiving tax receipts.
 - *Someone in-tune with non-profit regulations would need to look into the details of this.*
- Photographer bills the PAC/school directly
 - *The ease of this set-up is the reason that the discounted group rate is offered. It saves a lot of time on my end when every student is receiving the same thing and when I have one person paying the bill.*
- No fee for individual staff photos.
 - *Not every school wants individual staff photos, but this is something that we have done for South Canoe in the past.*
- No set up fee for photo day or one retakes day. Additional retakes days will incur a fee.
- No set up fee for Group photos taken on the individual photo days.
 - *This means doing the group photos in the fall instead of in the spring.*
- Separate group photo days will incur a fee.

Positives: Inclusive. Every student/family has easy access to photos. The school has access to photos of each student for MyEd and class projects. Outdoor photos for the outdoor school are still an option.

Negatives: Organization required by the school or PAC to collect fees from families. As with school fees now, some families will not be able to pay.

Option 2

- Only students who have pre-purchased digital packages are photographed.
- Rates will be higher than offered for the full-school option.
 - *\$26 for a single pose, as opposed to \$20 when purchasing as a group.*
- Purchased digital image files are edited and loaded into an online gallery for downloading.
- Families can purchase additional prints if they like.
- Prints can also be made independently by the families using the digital images.
- Purchases run directly through the photographer as they have in the past.
- A set up fee of \$250 will be billed to the school or PAC, which will cover photo day plus one retakes day. Additional retakes days will incur a fee.
- No additional set up fee for Group photos taken on individual photo days.
- Separate group photo days will incur a fee.
- Individual staff photos will incur a fee.

Ø my Ed.

Positives: Only those who want photos are included, reducing student time being used unnecessarily. Minimal work for school staff.

Negatives: Not inclusive. Exclusionary of those who can't afford photos or who forget to pre-order. More expensive for families. Set up fee for the school. School does not have access to images of students for MyEd or class use.

Group photos will still include all students and will be delivered to the school in a digital format.

Some additional notes:

The full school photo print is covered by me, and then the school decides how they would like to have it framed. The cost of framing is covered by the school.

Last year, the cost of professional framing for other schools was around \$350. (The cost may increase a bit this year.) The school benefits from the discount that the framer extends to my clients, and I do not collect any commission or fee on this. The school could also buy a frame from a retail location or have a school parent or class do the framing.

*All noted prices are pre-tax.

Important notes about Option 2, as observed at other schools:

- Because this isn't the usual system that families are accustomed to, there can be quite a bit of confusion if communication isn't thorough.
- I don't provide the MyEd files in this structure because I don't have every student in front of my camera. Someone from the school can take each student's photo with a mobile phone immediately after their class photo. It requires more work by the school administration, but it's a fairly easy option.
- There were a few students at each school who wanted to have their photos taken, but their family hadn't signed up. These were not families who contacted me after the fact.
- It created a division in the students when some were called for photos and others weren't.
- When looking at the numbers, the money being spent on pre-registration is almost the same as if the entire school had signed up as a group.
